

#### LOCAL RULES

#### I OUT OF BOUNDS (RULE 18.2)

A ball is out of bounds if it comes to rest:

- I. In or beyond all boundary fences, hedges or markers (including the white posts to the left of the 3rd hole)
- 2. On the bowling green beyond the 18th green, or in the surrounding ditch
- 3. Beyond the white posts behind the 18th green and in the area to the left of the marker on the course toilet, extending back in a line parallel to the side of the course toilet towards the 1st tee
- 4. When playing the 10th hole the area to the right of the white marker posts that start at the ditch and extend to the last white marker post painted on the bell support and across the 17th fairway to the large tree in the boundary hedge.

### 2 RELIEF WITHOUT PENALTY

- I. If a ball strikes any power pole, power wires, bell or bell support, the stroke is cancelled and the player MUST play a ball as nearly as possible at the spot from which the original ball was played.
- Where a staked tree (or one marked in white or carrying a protective sleeve) interferes with the intended swing, the player MUST take relief.

- 3. A ball coming to rest on an artificial path or against its support boards may be lifted and dropped at the nearest point of relief no nearer the hole and not on the slope of a teeing area
- 4. All fixed sprinkler heads are immovable obstructions and relief from interference by them may be obtained under Rule 16.1. In addition, if a ball lies off the putting green but not in a hazard and a fixed sprinkler head within two club lengths of the putting green and within two club lengths of the ball intervenes with the line of play, the player may take relief as follows The ball shall be marked, lifted and dropped at the nearest point where the ball lay which (a) is not nearer to the hole, (b) is not in a hazard or on a putting green and (c) avoids such intervention. The ball may be cleaned when so lifted.
- 5. Stones in bunkers which interfere with play may be removed after notifying your fellow competitor(s).
- 6. On the 13th green if a ball lands on or is within 6 inches of the drainage hole. If the drainage hole interferes with the players stance or it is within 6 inches of a players line of putt, the ball may be lifted and placed at the nearest point of relief that is not in a hazard and no nearer to the hole.

The nearest point of relief may be off the putting green.

#### 3 GROUND UNDER REPAIR (RULE 16.1)

The following are declared as ground under repair - Ground marked with a white line, newly laid turf, any open stone-filled or sand-filled drains, temporary greens, all course gardens and shrubberies. Relief MUST be taken if a ball is in GUR.

# LOCAL GUIDANCE I - BRIDGES

A ball coming to rest upon a bridge (classified as an immovable obstruction) and within the margins of the hazard when extended vertically upwards, may be played as it lies. The club may touch the bridge at address (because the bridge is NOT ground within the hazard). No free relief is allowed. No relief is allowed from the bridge (immovable obstruction) when the ball is in a water hazard.

# LOCAL GUIDANCE 2 - TRACTOR MARKS

Marks made by green keepers vehicles do not constitute abnormal ground conditions. However, should the tyre marks made by a tractor or similar vehicle be considered deep rutted (Abnormal Ground) then relief may be taken under Rule 16-1.
